Challenge Coin Rules:


Rules of the Challenge Coin must be explained to all new coin holders. These rules apply to anyone who has earned, been awarded, has purchased, or who is known to be a previous coin holder.

- 1. Your coin MUST be carried at all times. You can be challenged for it anywhere, at any time. You must produce the coin without taking more than 4 steps to produce it.
- 2. When challenging, the challenger must state whether it is for a single drink or a round of drinks.
- 3. Failure to produce a coin, for whatever reason, results in a bought round or single drinks (whatever the challenger stated). This type of transaction could be expensive, so hold onto your coin. You cannot challenge the same person more than once in a 24 hour period.
- 4. If all that are challenged produce their coins, the challenger loses and must buy the drinks for all respondents. This too can be expensive, so challenge wisely.
- 5. If a coin is lost, replacement is up to the individual. A new coin should be acquired at the earliest opportunity -- losing a coin and not replacing it doesn't relieve a member of his or her responsibilities.
- 6. There are no exceptions to the rules. They apply to clothed or un-clothed. One step and an arm's reach are allowed.
- 7. A Coin is a Coin. They are not belt buckles, key chains or necklaces. Coins worn in a holder around the neck are valid.
- 8. It is an honor to earn a coin, let's keep it that way. It is a higher honor to be the one who gives a coin. A given or awarded coin is of more personal value than a purchased coin.

Happy Birthday, Seabees!

As March 5 was the 79th Anniversary of the Naval Construction Force, I want to say Happy Birthday to my fellow Seabees! But did you know that March 5th was not always the date that we recognized as the Seabee Birthday?

During World War II, Rear Admiral Ben Moreell, Chief of the Bureau of Yards and Docks, recognized the need for the construction of advanced bases in combat zones. To meet this need, he requested specific authority to activate, organize, and man Navy construction units. As a result, the first Seabee units were authorized on 5 January 1942, and official authorization of the Seabee name and insignia occurred on 5 March 1942.



Moreell requested authority to recruit enlisted personnel to serve in a naval construction force.

In the early 1950s, Rear Admiral John R. Perry recognized that the December 28th date fell at a hectic time of the year. Many Seabees were on leave during this time because it fell between Christmas and New Year's Eve. Because of this, Rear Admiral Perry decided to find a new day suitable for the celebration of the Seabee's birthday.

Several historically significant dates in Seabee history were considered for the new birthdate. One of these was October 31, because, on that date in 1941, the Chief of the Bureau of Navigation directed Admiral Moreell to form a Headquarters Construction Company of 99 men for duty in Iceland. March 19 was also considered because on that day in 1942 the Secretary of the Navy authorized Civil Engineer Corps Officers of the newly formed Construction Battalions.

After much deliberation by leadership, March 5, 1942, was determined to be the most appropriate day to celebrate the Seabee birthday. Not only was that the date the Construction Battalions were given official permission to assume the name "Seabees", but it was also the anniversary of the Civil Engineer Corps which had been established in 1867.


A good number of the NMCB-14 Alumni Members and Officers were in attendance for this Gala Event.

Never Forgotten

NMCB 14 ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

During the 2003-2004 Iraqi Freedom deployment of NMCB 14, seven of its Seabees were killed and 34 wounded. In 2004, a Purple Heart Ceremony was held at NAS Jacksonville, Florida where NMCB 14 has its headquarters. It was well-attended by the military community, as well as retired and former members of NMCB 14. As a result of this gathering, **Capt. Bob Brockway** organized a small group of key retired officers and enlisted personnel to form an alumni association with a primary mission of aiding the families of those NMCB 14 personnel who were killed or wounded during Iraqi Freedom and any future conflict casualties.



On March 12, 2005, a meeting of the organizing committee was held at the Best Western Hotel & Suites in Orange Park, Florida. Those in attendance were **Jack Araneo**, **Bob Brockway**, **Randy Bushey**, **Ron Helton**, **Al Kenny**, **Bill Purkis**, **Joe Schweigart**, **Bill Tydings**, and **Mike Wood**. **Neil Orange**, who also was part of the organizing committee, was not able to attend. An organization was set up and interim appointments were made to the Executive Committee (Board of Directors and Officers). The initial purpose of the Association was in keeping with the following goals:

- 1. Camaraderie within the Seabee community, inclusive of all Navy rates, ranks, and designators.
- 2. Support of the inclusive Seabee community.
- 3. Communications with members.
- 4. Historical restoration and preservation.
